T.S.R.& E.R.R. Government Degree College follows the academic calendar issued by affiliated University Krishna University. Hence the college tried to deliver the curriculum in a well planned manner. In spite of the limited strength in the academic year, the faculties of all departments focused on the strengths and weaknesses of students. All the arts stream students were assessed with simple assignments, seminars. BRIDGE courses were conducted in the beginning of the academic year to enhance the orientation about the subjects. Surprise exams, both objective and Descriptive were initiated to instill the confidence among students. All the students were encouraged to clear their doubts from the Faculty in a flexible manner like off the time classes, meeting them in the departments. Generally, our college conducted Internal assessments that are suitable to the abilities of students. They were given a schedule as per Krishna University for conducting Internal exams. Occasionally, we encouraged students to prepare answers in chart from in case of Formulae, point wise to remember the concept. Their performance in these was also considered for Internal Assessments. Exams on paper were conducted once in a month and Summative Assessment at the end of the semester. Faculty planned their annual curriculum and prepared teaching plans, diaries and Teaching notes. The college always put efforts to implement the curriculum in an effective manner and measures were taken to implement it in a rational manner.
